Background

Unlimited human wants with limited resources to satisfy them make the lives and livelihoods of people especially of poor more complex. Moreover, people/organizations often face the multidimensional and dynamic nature of problems, which need to be understood scientifically to address them. Academicians from various disciplines those are committed to research with development perspective, in the arena of globalisation, do face challenges of the questions like what, why, how, when and whom with respect to the emerging socio-economic and environmental changes in different context. Development research aims at to enable, through the acquired body of scientific knowledge and skill, to understand empirical phenomena, seek appropriate and reliable information, get valid conclusion and pertinent way forward.

Objective

1. To equip the participants for preparing research design on development issues;
2. To improve the knowledge and the skill on important steps and processes of development research including Participatory Rural Appraisal (PRA);
3. To make the participants familiar with different types of development research such as baseline study and impact assessment;
4. To equip the participants on reliability and validity of research, qualitative and quantitative (scientific application of statistical tools) data analysis, and reporting research.

Programme Coverage

The programme is consisting of the following three modules.

Module-1: Preparation of research design on development issues

- Define a research problem
- Important components of a research problem statement
- Writing literature review
- Scientific application of sampling techniques
- Methods of data collection

Module-2: Baseline study and impact assessment of development interventions

- Baseline study
 - Guidelines and Case Analysis
- Impact assessment
 - Guidelines and Case Analysis
- Participatory rural appraisal (PRA)
 - Field demonstration

Module-3: Reliability and validity in research, qualitative and quantitative data analysis, and research reporting

- Reliability in research
- Validity in research
- Qualitative and quantitative data analysis
- Reporting research



Duration of the workshop

The programme is scheduled to be held for nine days from 16th December to 24th December 2019

Pedagogy

The programme will be skill oriented and would emphasise hands-on experience through interactive lectures, case analysis, computer lab and field demonstration. Participants coming with own laptop will be an added advantage to them.

Unique Feature

The uniqueness of this FDP is that after the course, each participant has to take up a small research on any development issue in rural areas and produce the report within three months. The purpose of this study is to apply the research knowledge and skill got through the course immediately. Moreover, it may go into rural management education curriculum. Each participant will be provided with Rs. 20,000 as research grant after successful submission of the report.

Accommodation

Outstation participants, who are in need of accommodation, will be provided on request.

Who should participate

This programme is open for faculty members from colleges or universities interested in doing social research with development perspective. This course needs no prior training on research or statistical methods, though experience in these areas will be useful.

Apply

Interested participants are required to submit the scan copy of the filled in Registration Form along with their CV to the following e-mail Id (damodarjena@ksrm.ac.in) on or before 13 December 2019. A total of 15-20 eligible participants will be considered on first-cum-first basis. The Registration Form is attached herewith. Completing course (all the three modules) is necessary but not sufficient to get the certificate. As mentioned earlier, the participants will get certificate after submitting the study report within three months of FDP course completion.
